Parts of the tree. This large tree first came from Persia & was probably brought to England by the Romans. The roots go deep so that the tree is never blown down. The leaves resemble those of the common ash. They have flowers in May & fruit in September. So important is the fruit that the tree is named after it. This fruit, the walnut, is green when growing and oval. It has a husk on outside the shell. If required for pickling, it is gathered when young, pricked all over, soaked in brine nine days & left in the sun till it turns black. It is then covered with boiling vinegar till eaten. If the nut is going to be eaten in the ordinary way, the outside husk is removed before it is sold. We then find a shell which separates into 2 halves, these shells are very thin; some people can crush them between their finger & thumb. They are channelled or grooved instead of being smooth. Inside is a kernel, good to eat, covered by a thin skin, grooved like the shell, & almost separates
